



Biography

Kevin T. Brady is the president of the American Institute for History Education, a position he has held since 2003.

The holder of a doctorate in history from Temple University in Philadelphia, PA, Brady is an expert on Irish and Irish-American history. He has been an author, contributing author or consultant for numerous articles and interactive CD-ROMs on the subjects of teaching history and developing curricula for various levels of education. He also currently serves as the vice president of the American Institute for Historians and History Educators. From 2002 to 2003 he was the director of the Rutgers/LEAP Academy University High School in Camden, N.J. and director of the Institute for Best Practices and Innovations in Urban Education, Center for Strategic Urban Community Leadership at Rutgers University's Camden Campus also in Camden.

He is currently on the board of directors for the New Jersey Council for the Social Studies. From 1999 to 2004 he was a member of the board of trustees for the New Jersey Council for History Education.

Brady has appeared before numerous audiences either as a speaker or member of a panel discussion. Some of these include the New Jersey Council for the Social Studies, at Georgian Court University in Lakewood, N.J.; the New Jersey Historical Commission in Trenton, N.J.; the CS4 Conference of State Social Studies Specialists at the National Council for the Social Studies in Washington, D.C., and the National Council for Community and Justice Conference at the Princeton Theological Seminary in Princeton, N.J.

He has also served as a history consultant to numerous organizations including providing Oral History Training with the New Jersey Network for the PBS "The War" by Ken Burns, The New Jersey Italian American Heritage Commission, The New Jersey Amistad Commission, and many Teaching American History Grants and Liberty Fellowships across the United States.

Among his many noteworthy career accomplishments, Brady served as chairman of the Middle States accreditation Social Studies Committee from 1990 through 1993 and

was also a member of the Middle States accreditation Religion Committee during that same time period. From 2004 through 2005, he was an assistant professor of Education at Georgian Court University in Lakewood, N.J. Before that he served as an adjunct professor at Camden County College in Camden, N.J. where he taught World Civilizations I and U.S. History I. Brady has also taught at George Mason University (Fairfax, VA.), Temple University (Philadelphia) and Cumberland County College (Vineland, N.J.)

His understanding of the needs of secondary education providers comes from his own experience teaching at the high school level. From 1993 through 2000 he taught high school Social Studies at several Southern New Jersey schools including Camden Catholic High School (Cherry Hill, N.J.), Kingsway Regional High School (Woolwich Twp., N.J.) and West Deptford High School (Westville, N.J.)
